Reflection:

Did Jesus give a new commandment to his disciples according to the gospel passage of today? Were people not practicing love before the time of Jesus? Certainly! they were.

But let us take our minds back to the scriptures, specifically the Old testaments. The Jews had two commandments of love enunciated in Deuteronomy chapter 6:5 which is – "Love of God" and in Leviticus chapter 19:18 which is about – "Love of neighbour". Jesus himself described these two passages as the first and second greatest commandments of the Law. (Mt. 22:37-39; Mk 12:29-31). So, the question is, how was the commandment given by Jesus new?

In fact, one of the most explicit passages in the scripture that portresses distinctively the summary of the Ten Commandment was that of Matthew 22:23-40. In that passage was the reply of Jesus to a lawyer who enquired to know the greatest commandment in the law. And Jesus was explicit in his reply to the lawyer "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your Soul, and with all your mind. And a second is like it, you shall love your neighbour as yourself".

This newness of Jesus's commandment lay in its application. For instance, a neighbour that a Jew, is expected to love was another Jew, for a disciples of Christ, the neighbour is every man and woman, friend, and foe alike. A Jew had no business loving a Roman or a Samaritan, not only was he not required to love his enemy, but he is required to exact an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth. But Jesus says – Not so for you and me because we are Christians, his followers, Jesus preached to the Jews at the time, he says to them, a Samaritan is neighbour to a Jew as we learn in the parable of the "Good Samaritan." (Luke 10:29-37) in our own context today, who do you think is your neighbour?

Also, the Jewish commandment of love was "You must love your neighbour as yourself" (Lev 19-18). Jesus's new commandment is rather "Love one another as I have loved you" (Jn 15:12). When you hear or read what comes next, you will know that it goes far beyond loving your neighbour as yourself. In the next verse Jesus says, "No one can have a greater love than to lay down his life for his friends" (Jn 15:13). And Jesus went ahead to show it by dying on the cross for us, his friends. That is much and how he has loved us.

If Jesus then commands us to love one another as he has loved us, it means that we must be prepared to go the extra mile for our 'neighbour' — making sacrifices? What that means is, we should be ready to make sacrifices, to deny ourselves certain things like material things, food, clothes, giving our time to others, our comfort or simply a listening ear to those who need to be listened to. St. Mother Theresa says, "I have found the paradox that if you love until it hurts, there can be no more hurt, only more love." Most people choose the way of love but STOP loving when it begins to hurt. Loving like Jesus asked us to without expecting pains and disappointments will be an illusion
