Reflection: Saints Peter and Paul

In the tradition of the Catholic Church, the names of Peter and Paul are always seen together, and we celebrate their solemnity together yet, the truth is that the two men were actually very different from each other. Peter was a Hebrew Jew and Paul, was Greek Jew, Peter was a fisherman by profession, Paul was well educated at least in Hebrew sacred Scripture and Law. Peter knew Jesus in flesh and was his disciples for three years, why Paul only had a post-resurrection encounter with Jesus on the road to Damascus. Peter was among the first people to become disciples of Jesus. Paul, as Saul, was a rabid persecutor of the followers of Jesus

Despite their differences, the two men had one thing in common that completely overshadowed their numerous differences. The lives of the two men actually converged in the things that really mattered: What they had in common was their single-minded and commitment to Jesus Christ, their missionary zeal, their witness to Christ through Martyrdom. That is why they have become to be known as "Princes of the Apostles", and their names nearly always occur together in the tradition of the Catholic Church.

The examples of SS Peter and Paul show, among other things, that the followers of Jesus can be united, no matter what differences they may have among then in terms of race, colour, nationality, tribe, language, education or social status. What they had in common is Christ, and He is Bigger than all the differences, real or imagined.

For them, their differences were not seen as a source of division or disunity but seen as togetherness as followers of Jesus and relate to one another as brothers and sisters. These differences should not prevent the followers of Christ from working together in the proclamation of his Good News to the ends of the earth. Just like SS Peter and Paul, we are all called to be committed to Christ and devote our total lives to his course.
