# Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C. SUNDAY NOV. 16th, 2025

#### Reflection:

The Sadducees were the ruling class of the Jewish society during the time of Jesus, and the high priest was always one of their number. Unfortunately, they did not believe in life after death, or, as our Gospel reading puts it today, they did not believe in the resurrection. They rather believed that once a person died, that was the end of him or her. He or she simply ceased to exist. There opponents were the Pharisees and the Scribes, who were the religious elite. They believed in the resurrection. It was the Sadducees who took their case to Jesus. They probably suspected that Jesus too believed in the resurrection like the Pharisees and the Scribes.

And so, to prove him wrong, they told a fantastic story of a woman with exceptionally bad luck, who went through marriage to seven brothers in succession and managed to send them all to their grave without giving birth to a single child.

Jesus did not only confirm the suspicion of the Pharisees that he believed in the resurrection, but he also pointed out how very wrong their own position was. First, the woman in question would not be anybody's wife in the life after death since there would no longer be any marriages. Secondly, Moses, the greatest teacher of all Jewish people, including the Sadducees, referred to the Lord as the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob in the present tense. He would not have done that if those three men had ceased to exist after their deaths. They must have still existed. Only then could the Lord be said to be their God in the present tense.

Belief in life after death is common to many religions. It is central to Christianity. St. Paul, in particular, insisted on it. he said, for instance, in 1 Corinthians 15:16-17: "For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised. If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile, and you are still in your sins." That explains why belief in life after death is an article of the Christian Creed. We say that we believe "in the resurrection of the body and life everlasting
