## **Reflection:** WE ARE HIS TEMPLE

God is Spirit. He does not live in buildings. In fact, he is everywhere. In every religion people have always set aside certain places for the worship of God. In the Old Testament we read about God giving precise instructions to the Israelites to set aside a specific place where they would worship him. Before then, while they wandered in the wilderness on their journey from Egypt to the promise land, it was a tent (tabernacle) and after they settled down in the Promise land, it was to be a Temple. God gave clear instructions as to what could be done. Essentially, the Temple was to be set aside exclusively for prayer; that is, worship, including sacrifice.

In the course of time, people began to do other things in the Temple that were not prayer, things that can be grouped under 'commerce' – buying and selling. But Jesus was not impressed. The Temple was simply not meant for commerce; they could have been done outside the Temple. This made Jesus to resolve in violence to drive home his point. The matter was serious.

Today, we Christians have buildings called "Churches". In the Catholic church we believe that all our churches are as holy, even holier than the Jewish Temple of old. The reason is that what goes on in our churches is far superior to what went on in the Jewish Temple. In the Temple the Jews offered sacrifices of animals. In our churches it is the very Son of God himself, our Lord Jesus Christ who offers himself in a single everlasting sacrifice to his Father. In addition, most of our churches have the real presence of Jesus in the blessed sacrament that is preserved in the tabernacle. This makes our churches much more house of prayers than the Jewish temple and deserve far more respect and reverence than we often accorded it with. In today's Gospel passage, St. John speaks of the "sanctuary" that was the body of Jesus. That was the temple Jesus said he would rebuild in three days if the Jews destroyed it. In the same way the true and proper Church is the Body of Christ, the People of God, not any building of stone, marble or glass. That is what we hear St. Paul saying in today's second reading: "You are God's building", "Didn't you know that you were God's temple ..?"
